

ORDINARY TIME BEGINS!

The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that the Church's liturgical year "unfolds the whole mystery of Christ" (CCC 1194). Ordinary Time is an essential part of this unfolding. Far from being a pause between major feasts, it is the season in which we walk closely with Christ in His public ministry—listening to His parables, witnessing His miracles, and learning how He calls ordinary people to an extraordinary life of discipleship.

During Ordinary Time, the Church does not focus on a single event, but on the continuous presence and action of Christ in the world. The green vestments worn during this season symbolize growth, hope, and maturity in the spiritual life. As the Catechism teaches, the liturgy leads the faithful to live out the mystery of Christ in daily life (cf. CCC 1075). In this way, Ordinary Time forms us gradually, shaping our hearts through repetition, reflection, and perseverance.

This season teaches us that holiness is not reserved for feast days alone. It is cultivated in faithfulness to prayer, obedience to God's will, love of neighbor, and quiet trust in God amid the routines of life. Ordinary Time invites us to recognize that God works powerfully in the ordinary—and that every day, when lived with faith, becomes a sacred encounter with Christ.
